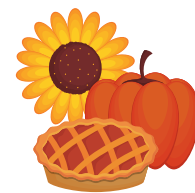

Another very important issue that will be on your ballot is the bond to enhance the Weber County Justice Center. In short, the Jail needs expansion to house an ever-increasing number of inmates. The population has increased and unfortunately, crime has also increased. I personally believe that this is a much-needed expansion to help slow down the revolving door and help increase safety and security for the public. Please take the time to educate yourselves on this important subject. Weber County Sheriff's Office has published much about why this is needed. You can find a lot of great information on their website. This is certainly a key aspect of the role of government.

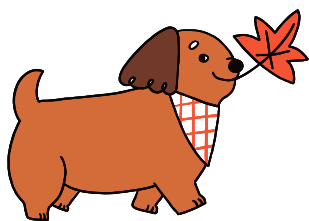
