2021 Founders Day Honorees


2021 Founders Day Grand Marshals - Jerry and Cynthia Naylor



On April 1, 1956, Jerry and Cynthia Naylor moved to Pleasant View where they raised a family of five children. Both have been active members in the community and their church. Jerry is the owner of Valley Glass, a prominent northern Utah Glass Business. Jerry served in the United States Navy aboard the USS Platt during the Korean War, where he received many awards and citations for service above and beyond the call of duty. Jerry served on the Pleasant View City Council for two terms during the 1960s. He and council member Betty Tucker planned the first founder's day activity to bring the small community together. Jerry's motto is, "Be included in as many things as possible." He certainly took his own advice. Jerry served on the Foundation Board of McKay-Dee Hospital as it was being built, Ogden Rotary for 35 years, gate judge for the 2002 Winter Olympics, and the Ogden Pioneer Days Rodeo Committee. Jerry and Cynthia served an LDS Mission in the Washington DC Temple where they met Mac Christensen, better known as Mr. Mac, who was their Mission President. They became great friends. The Naylor's have been amazing members of our community, and we are happy to honor them as this year's grand marshals.

2021 Honorary Grand Marshal - Rulon Ashcroft

Rulon Ashcroft was born in Eager, Arizona in 1933. His early years were rich, he was raised in a home where love of God and country were solidly observed. His early life was spent working on his family ranch and going to school. After graduation, he was privileged to serve two years in the U.S. Army during the Korean campaign. Rulon was called to serve an LDS Mission to the Western Canadian Mission. After his return, he was able to attend Brigham Young University where he met the love of his life Caryl Jacobs. He and Caryl were blessed with four beautiful daughters, 15 grandchildren and six great-grandchildren. Rulon worked at Hill AFB and was able to move to the North Ogden/Pleasant View area in 1975. With all the places he has lived, moving to Pleasant View has proven to be a highlight of his life. Rulon and his family found the people here to be friendly and genuine, and they have made a wonderful home in Pleasant View that they cherish. Rulon can be found walking on the Pleasant View path making friends with everyone he meets. His smile and quick wit will win you over instantly, and you just know you are his best friend. Rulon is the first to volunteer for any assignment he is asked to do. Rulon is the grandfather that we all wish we could have. He can often be found sitting on the bench, he donated in the memory of his loving wife, along the walking path on Pleasant View Drive. Even if you have never met Rulon, you will always receive a kind smile and a wave. We are pleased to recognize him as our Honorary Grand Marshal for Founder's Day this year.



2021 Important Founders Day Traffic & Parking Information

Founder's Day 5K – Beginning at 7:00am and estimated to last until 8:00am

Traffic will be affected between 500 West Weber High Drive and 600 West Weber High Drive, 600 West Weber High Drive to 600 West Elberta Drive and between 500 West Elberta Drive.



Parade- Road closures will begin at 8:30am and estimated to last until 11:30

Elberta Drive will be closed from 400 West to the Round about

500 West will be closed from Weber High Drive to Elberta Drive

600 West from Weber High Drive to Pleasant View Drive

700 West Pleasant View Drive to 1100 West Pleasant View Drive will be closed beginning at 9:30am



Salmon Bake - Beginning at 4:00pm and will last until 7:00pm

600 West from Pleasant View Drive to 3000 North will become a one-way street for Southbound Traffic only. The upper North parking lot will be for handicap parking. All others are asked to park in the South lot.

Fireworks

Following the fireworks, vehicles will not be able to get in or around Weber High School. 500 West from Weber High Drive to Elberta Drive and 400 West Weber High Drive to 500 West Weber High Drive will be closed to allow pedestrian traffic for those who choose to park at Weber High School. We ask that cars not be parked on the street in the areas to be closed.
