Qualifications for a candidate are:

- 1. Registered voter.
- 2. Resident of the Pleasant View for a period of 12 consecutive months immediately preceding the date of the election.
- 3. No mentally incompetent person, any person convicted of a felony, or any person convicted of treason or a crime against the elective franchise may not hold office in this state until the right to hold elective office is restored.

To become a candidate a Declaration of Candidacy shall be filed in person at the City Hall, located at 520 W Elberta Drive between June 1st and June 7th. City Hall is open between the hours of 8:00 AM to 5:00 PM Monday thru Friday.



Green Waste Vouchers are available for the season once again at City Hall. One voucher per household. This pass will take \$5.00 off the normal fee at Weber County's green waste facility. Please stop by, call (801) 782-8529 or email dminert@pleasantviewcity.com to request your voucher.

Rules for Placing Containers out for Collection



Place containers side-by-side in the street, 6 feet apart, with wheels against the curb. Do not overfill; lids must be completely closed.

Keep all containers 6 feet away from anything that may block the collection truck, including parked cars, trees, and

Keep your neighborhood litter free and clean-Containers CANNOT be overloaded.

There should not be excess waste on top of, around, or protruding from container. Containers that are overloaded may not dump correctly and may spill trash. If you need anothe container, please contact your city.

The 6 Foot Rule Containers must be placed at least

of feet away from other cans, light posts, mail bowes, fences, or other structures. Containers must also have an overhead clearance of 14 feet. These measures will allow the truck's lifting arm to access and properly dump the can.

What <u>CAN</u> go in the container?

Normal household trash

What <u>CANNOT</u> go in the container?

Please, never put any of the following materials in the trash. These materials can harm refuse/waste collectors, the equipment, and the environment:

- Liquids of any type (paint, gas, oil, hazardous materials)
- Hot coals, ashes, or lit cigarettes
- Building and construction debris (dirt/rocks, tree trunks, carpets or large scraps
- Purniture, appliances, or auto parts (water heaters, major appliances, couches/chairs, car bumpers, fenders, engine blocks, batteries, items over 50 lbs)


