MAYOR'S MESSAGE

We have had a mild winter and a so-so spring when it comes to our water year. The Governor declared a state of emergency for all of Utah with snowpack averaging 70% of normal. Please do all you can to prepare your watering systems to reduce the amount of watering this year. As far as I know, Pineview water is scheduled to start charging their system on April 19th so the time to act is right now.

The City Council and the Mayor's office is very aware about the possible permanent closing of Pleasant View Drive at 400 E. (Washington Blvd.). North Ogden City has proposed this and is actively exploring this option. We are very much opposed to a permanent closure and have expressed our position to their council. We believe that any perceived safety issues at the intersection can be remedied by making eastbound traffic a right turn only option. We will continue to push for a solution that will benefit all users of this roadway. We will keep you posted. Also, please pay attention to our social media posts as sometime soon there will be a public hearing in North Ogden that will give each of you a chance to join with us on the Council to express concerns. We are committed in continuing to work with the officials in North Ogden to try and resolve their safety concerns while still maintaining this historic corridor.

I am saddened by the loss of life of members of our community from this dreadful pandemic. Consequences of contracting this virus can prove deadly. Vaccination opportunities have now been opened to all individuals 16 and older. I would exhort each of you to take this opportunity to be vaccinated. 

VEHICLE BURGLARIES

With the weather getting better the Pleasant View Police Department is seeing an increase in night time thefts and vehicle burglaries. The bad guys are being dropped off in our neighborhoods then walking around looking for anything to steal in yards, garages and mostly vehicles. Unlocked vehicles were usually the target, now if there are any valuables in sight they will break out the windows of locked vehicles to steal your property. In one recent case they shot out the car window to gain entry. Enclosed trailers are also being entered locked or unlocked and the property from inside stolen. We have also had the entire trailer taken. Construction sites are having tools stolen from inside locked trailers after the locks are cut. Please keep your vehicles, homes and garages locked and all valuables out of sight. Listen for unusual noise at night from outside your home or your neighbor's homes. Outdoor lighting is also recommended. Thieves keep returning to our area because it is profitable for them. PVPD is stepping up patrols to help catch the suspects or discourage their activity in our area.
