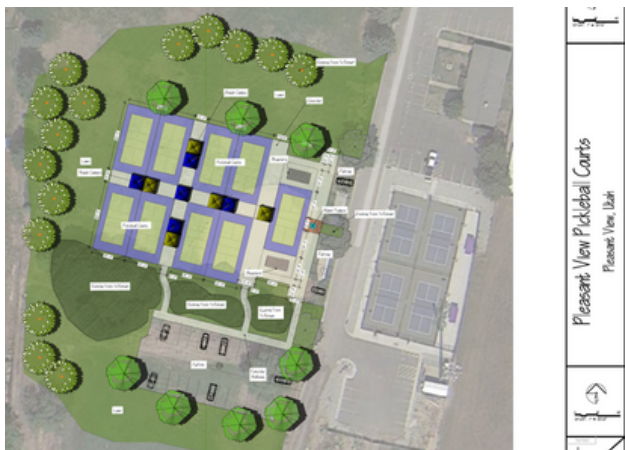

PICKLEBALL TOURNAMENT COMPLEX FACILITY MAJOR GRANT AWARDED

Pleasant View City is excited to announce it has been awarded a major grant from Weber County RAMP. The grant, totaling \$315,000, will assist in the construction of a new pickleball tournament facility at Pleasant View Park. This effort was initiated by Council Members Ann Arrington and Sara Urry to address the requests of residents who are passionate about expanding local pickleball offerings.

This effort was further organized with the creation of the Pleasant View Pickleball Association (PVPA), a non-profit organization and the fundraising arm of this effort. Bonnie Clark was instrumental in establishing this new association.

Current volunteers of the PVPA include:

The initial stages of this project have been impressive, generating interest throughout Pleasant View and neighboring communities. On November 9, 2021, the Pleasant View Mayor and City Council approved the pursuit of this project by resolution, allocating use of the land and \$5,000 of funding approved for design.

The generous support, donations and contributions from several community members and business owners will allow this project to be completed with little city funding required. The project is anticipated and hoped to begin construction Fall 2022. The City is incredibly grateful for all of the businesses and community partners involved thus far and is looking forward to additional partners joining in to help this project become a reality and to cross the finish line.
