FEE SCHEDULE CHANGES TO UTILITY ACCOUNTS

Pleasant View City utility customers will see an increase in their sewer, garbage and recycling fees starting July 1st. These are pass through fees that go to Central Weber Sewer and Econowaste.

The average utility customer will see a \$3.00 - \$4.00 increase in their monthly bill.

Sewer: \$26.55 to \$27.80

Garbage: \$10.00 to \$11.65 (Extra can: \$11.00 to \$12.65)

Recycling: \$4.25 to \$4.45 (Extra can: \$5.00 to \$5.30)

Replacement garbage can: \$105.00 to \$134.00


