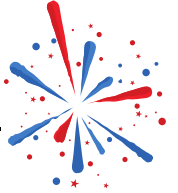

# 2022 Founders Day Honorees

## 2022 Founders Day Grand Marshals - Tim and Colette Healy

Tim and Collette Healy moved to Pleasant View over 50 years ago after serving in the Navy in California. Shortly after arriving, Tim was asked to "run for Mayor"! He served for 4 years and during this time, a sewer system was installed; street signs were placed throughout the city; and Pleasant View created the first Police Department. Later, He was on the Board of Adjustments for several years. Tim was always proud to be an attorney, as he served thousands of people in need of legal help. He retired after 35 years!

They both have been very active in Community Service. Collette was the PTA President of Lomond View Elementary, North Ogden Jr. High and Weber High. Tim served by her side. They raised 6 successful children, including 2 adopted from Bolivia. Several foster children were welcomed in

their home. Collette and Tim are proud of their International Family; USA, Canada, Bolivia, Korea, and India are represented!

Collette was selected as "Weber County Mother of the Year" and "Utah Mother of the Year" in 2001.

They helped with Founders Day for years. One year they honored Tom Chambers, when he and his family moved back to Pleasant View. Another year, Leonard Arrington performed, "Family Reunion" at Weber High to the delight of the crowd! Dutch Oven Chicken was served at Shady Lane Park back then!

The Healys helped with the first Easter Egg Hunts and decorated thousands of hard boiled eggs! What fun they had hiding all those eggs in the grass at the Park. Tim was in the blue bunny suit many times! It was a family affair.

Collette and Tim were Olympic volunteers for the Opening and Closing Ceremonies in 2002. They escorted the former Olympic Ice Skating champions, Dick Button and Dorothy Hamill...and also Donny and Marie Osmond!

The Healys are Patriotic! Colonel Tim served in the Army; Navy; and then Air Force for a combined total of 32 years. They fly Old Glory with pride!

They are now serving on the Pleasant View Heritage Foundation....decorating another float for FOUNDERS DAY! Tim and Collette love, love Pleasant View!

## 2022 Honorary Grand Marshal - Judy Sherman

Judy is the unofficial salmon bake ambassador and is always the first person to ask about purchasing tickets each year as well as the first one to line up at the salmon bake on Founders Day. Judy always pays her utility bill in person so she can catch up with the girls in the office, who love visiting with her. She is known and loved by her neighbors and loves them back.

Despite having had both knees and hips replaced, and a disc fused in her back, she walks on Elberta Drive most days, rides her stationary bike, and never misses her Yoga class. She is an active member of Ascension Lutheran Church.

Richard passed away in 2020 but his legacy and community spirit still lives on in their family and our great community. He was a hardcore Scouter.

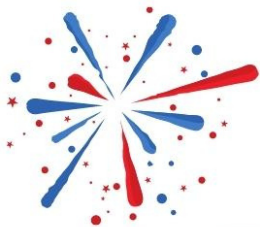

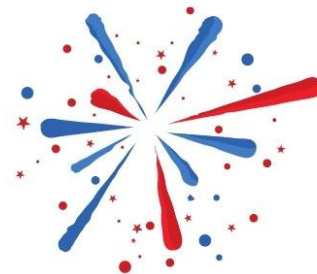
She loves living in Pleasant View and rubbing shoulders with such amazing people.

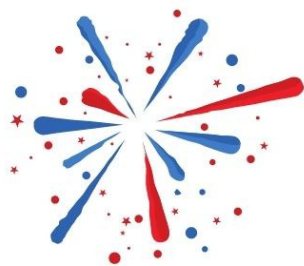

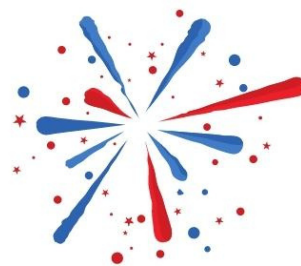

**Founder's Day 5k - Beginning at 7:00am and estimated to last until 8:00am**

Traffic will be affected between 500 West Weber High Drive and 600 West Weber High Drive,  
600 West Weber High Drive to 600 West Elberta Drive  
And between 500 West Elberta Drive and 600 West Elberta Drive.



**Parade-Road closures will begin at 8:30am and estimated to last until 11:30**

Elberta Drive will be closed from 400 West to the Round about  
500 West will be closed from Weber High Drive to Elberta Drive  
600 West from Weber High Drive to Pleasant View Drive  
700 West Pleasant View Drive to 1100 West Pleasant View Drive will be closed beginning at 9:00am



**Salmon Bake - Beginning at 4:00pm and will last until 7:00pm**

600 West from Pleasant View Drive to 3000 North will become a one-way street for Southbound Traffic only. The upper North parking lot will be for handicap parking. All others are asked to park in the South lot.

### Fireworks

Following the fireworks, vehicles will not be able to get in or around Weber High School. 500 West from Weber High Drive to Elberta Drive and 400 West Weber High Drive to 500 West Weber High Drive will be closed to allow pedestrians traffic for those who choose to park at Weber High School.
