If you give us your contact information we can contact you with an explanation of what can be done about the issue and save you from submitting repeated requests.

Round-A-Bout Know How

The round-a-bout at the intersection of Pleasant View Drive, Elberta Drive, and 700 West was installed to improve traffic safety and flow. However, when the round-a-bout is improperly used it can be dangerous. Please remember the following round-a-bout rules:



- Slow down when approaching the round-a-bout.
- Always yield to traffic already circulating in the round-a-bout.
- Round-a-bouts are one-way traffic—always counter-clockwise.

Weber County Drive-Thru Flu Clinic

Weber-Morgan Health Department will kick off its 2018 fluprevention season with a drive-thru flu clinic, October 2, from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m., in the health department parking lot, 477 23rd Street in downtown Ogden.

Cost is \$30 for each injectable shot and \$59 for the high-dose quadrivalent vaccine recommended for those over 65. Most insurances cover the cost of the vaccine so participants are encouraged to bring their insurance and Medicare/Medicaid cards with them.
