- 3. Youth City Council. Award Youth City Council Scholarships.

 Hailey Lynn and Court Henderson were awarded the Youth City Council Scholarships.
- 4. Grand Marshals, Honorary Grand Marshal and Bike Parade Chief. Introduction and presentation for the 2023 Founders Day Grand Marshals and Chief.

Eldon & Cooky Cottle were chosen as the Grand Marshals. John Reynolds was chosen as the Honorary Grand Marshal and Bridger Wangsgard was chosen as the Bike Parade Chief.

5. Fiber Optic Franchise Agreement with Connext LLC. Discussion and consideration of a franchise agreement in partnership with Connext LLC. who intends to begin installation and service of a fiber optic network throughout the city. (*Presenter: Amy Mabey*)

<u>Amy Mabey</u>: there was a groundbreaking for Connext before this meeting. Connext wants to join and sign the same agreement as All West. Connext plans to install within 18 months.

Motion was made by <u>CM Arrington</u> to adopt a franchise agreement woth Connext LLC. 2nd by <u>CM Marriott</u>. Voting Aye: CM Arrington, CM Gibson, CM Marriott, CM Nelsen and CM Urry. 5-0

6. Professional Services Agreement with Beacon Code Consultants. Discussion and consideration of a professional services agreement with Beacon Code Consultants to serve as the city's building official. (*Presenter: Amy Mabey*)

Amy Mabey: this is a professional agreement with Beacon Code Consultants. We have worked with for one month prior as a trail. We have been impressed with them and their building services. Mayor Call: has this been reviewed by legal? Amy Mabey: not but I can have it reviewed. CM Urry: I have been impressed. CM Gibson: how does what we charge work? Amy Mabey: this is just for building permits. The fees are set on the fee schedule. CM Gibson: I don't agree with an hourly rate. Amy Mabey: the challenge is based on an average. Mayor Call: there is a difference in inspection for example a pool vs a \$2million home. We can look at recoup cost. Amy Mabey: he utilized City Inspect and he breaks out his billing. CM Gibson: I don't want this to get out of hand. Mayor Call: there is a termination clause. CM Gibson: I want it to work. I want a review in 6 months. Mayor Call: we can track that. Amy Mabey: I am going to have annual meetings with all contract holders.

Motion was made by <u>CM Urry</u> to approve the Professional Services Agreement with Beacon Code Consultants with a note to have legal review the agreement. 2nd by <u>CM Arrington</u>. Voting Aye: CM Arrington, CM Gibson, CM Marriott, CM Nelsen and CM Urry. 5-0

7. Disposition of Abandoned Water Line Section at 2550 North. Discussion and consideration of disposition of property to Wildcat Storage LLC. for the portion of an unused waterline within the footprint of property boundaries. (*Presenter: Amy Mabey*)

<u>Amy Mabey</u>: this is a waterline on Wildcat Storage that is for fire suppression only. Legal has not looked at this yet. It deems that they will keep that portion in good repair. This is a clean up item. <u>CM Gibson</u>: is it hooked up to our water? <u>Tyson Jackson</u>: the line stays there. Pepsi also has a similar line for fire line regulations. It is just a fire service line. <u>CM Gibson</u>: no negatives? <u>Tyson Jackson</u>: we are still in control of valve. If there is an illicit use of water we

can turn it off. <u>CM Marriott</u>: why? <u>Brandon Bell</u>: there is only one property owner now when there were several.

Motion was made by <u>CM Gibson</u> to approve the disposition of abandoned water line section at 2550 North to Wildcat Storage LLC as stated. 2nd by <u>CM Marriott</u>. Voting Aye: CM Arrington, CM Gibson, CM Marriott, CM Nelsen and CM Urry. 5-0

8. Municipal Code Amendment - MP-1. Discussion and possible action to consider amending the MP-1 (manufacturing) Ordinance to remove 'Single-Family Dwelling' from the list of uses. Public Hearing held May 23, 2023. Ordinance 2023-11. (Presenter: Brandon Bell)

<u>Brandon Bell</u>: the planning commission and the city council held public hearings. The planning commission is in support of the amendment. Staff view this as an incompatible use in that zone and a conflict. <u>Mayor Call</u>: it doesn't make sense in the MP-1 zone. <u>Amy Mabey</u>: if there are any single family uses currently they will be grandfathered in.

Motion was made by <u>CM Urry</u> to amend the MP-1 (manufacturing) Ordinance to remove 'Single-Family Dwelling' from the list of uses, Ordinance 2023-11. 2nd by <u>CM Nelson</u>. Roll call vote. Voting Ave: CM Arrington, CM Gibson, CM Marriott, CM Nelsen and CM Urry. 5-0

9. General Plan. Discussion and possible action to consider amending the General Plan Master Street Map. Ordinance 2023-14. (*Presenter: Amy Mabey*)

<u>Brandon Bell</u>: the planning commission made one suggested change with the addition of an east-west road to the map. <u>Dana Shuler</u> showed the old and new map and the legend. There were three railroad crossings but now one crossing. Dana Shuler show the Farr West Joint area. <u>Mayor Call</u>: did we submit an 80' road to WACOG? <u>Dana Shuler</u>: yes. <u>Amy Mabey</u>: we will work with the mobile home park to move them. <u>Mayor Call</u>: they have revamped the pads with new homes. <u>Amy Mabey</u>: there is 2025 funding from WACOG. <u>Council</u>: should we table the area between 2700 N/2550 N by the storage units. <u>Amy Mabey</u>: this is important dialog to go back to the planning commission. The council continued to review the section of the entire map. There were a few areas that need to be rechecked by Dana Shuler.

Motion was made by <u>CM Gibson</u> to approve the General Plan Map with a few checks from Dana Shuler and forward the as planned. 2nd by <u>CM Marriott</u>. Roll call vote. Voting Aye: CM Arrington, CM Gibson, CM Marriott, CM Nelsen and CM Urry. 5-0

10. Insurance Coverage. Discussion and possible action to approve Insurance Coverage for the fiscal year 2023-2024 with Utah Local Governments Trust. (*Presenter: Amy Mabey*)

Amy Mabey: there was some navigating with insurances. The Trust was using the Fraud Risk Assessment. That was resolved because Heather Gale's certification qualified for more points. Many of the other cities expressed concerns over the use of the Fraud Assessment and having to be in the very low category. There was a slight increase in the rates. The liability is \$64,246, property \$15,799.19, auto \$23,450.61.

Motion was made by <u>CM Urry</u> to approve the Insurance Coverage for the fiscal year 2023-2024 with Utah Local Governments Trust as stated. 2nd by <u>CM Arrington</u>. Voting Aye: CM Arrington, CM Gibson, CM Marriott, CM Nelsen and CM Urry. 5-0

11. Solid Waste Collection & Disposal. Discussion and possible approval of a Residential Solid Waste Collection & Disposal Contract with Republic Services. (*Presenter: Amy Mabey*)

<u>Amy Mabey</u>: the agreement is with Republic Services for recycling and garbage. There was not a high response for the RFP. They will use the existing pickup schedule. The prices have increased which was anticipated. The maintaining of equipment is in the contract. We worked out the 17 day gap between the ending day of Econo Waste and the beginning day for Republic

with an \$8k upfront cost. <u>Tyson Jackson</u>: the recycling cans are ours and we will be purchasing the blue cans. The extra cans travel around as needed. We need a stockpile of cans. It was suggested to look at a limit of 4 can per residents.

Motion was made by <u>CM Gibson</u> to accept the Residential Solid Waste Collection & Disposal Contract with Republic Services as stated. 2nd by <u>CM Nelson</u>. Voting Aye: CM Arrington, CM Gibson, CM Marriott, CM Nelsen and CM Urry. 5-0

12. Fraud Risk Assessment & Audit Committee. Review of the Fraud Risk Assessment and Audit Committee. (*Presenter: Laurie Hellstrom*)

The Fraud Risk Assessment was reviewed with the council. No action needed.

13. Asset Capitalization Threshold Policy. Discussion and possible action to amend the Asset Capitalization Threshold Policy. Policy 2023-1. (*Presenter: Laurie Hellstrom*)

Motion was made by <u>CM Arrington</u> to approve the Asset Capitalization Threshold Policy. 2nd by <u>CM Gibson</u>. Voting Aye: CM Arrington, CM Gibson, CM Marriott, CM Nelsen and CM Urry. 5-0

14. ARPA Employee retention agreement. Discussion and possible action to approve an employee retention agreement in accordance with American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funding received for the fiscal year 2022-2023. (Presenter: Amy Mabey)

Amy Mabey: we are requesting the use of ARPA funding for retention bonus for employees to secure a commitment for a year. If not they will need to make a refund to the city. This use qualifies for federal funding. CM Arrington: is this the same as last year? Amy Mabey: yes. Parttime help receives half the bonus and it is not for seasonal employees. This bonus is optional. CM Gibson: do you think it helped keep employees here? Tyson Jackson: we have been down three people and it did get us through a rough spot. For us it meant a lot. Mayor Call: after this there will be no more ARPA funding.

<u>Laurie Hellstrom</u> review budget changes and requests from the prior budget workshop as noted in the presented budget.

Can there be fishing at Barker Pond? Can there be recycling cans at Founder's Day? <u>Amy Mabey</u>: maybe there could be fishing at the Horseshoe pond. You would need to reach out to Weber County.

The Pickleball tournament is full so don't advertise. <u>CM Urry</u>: I am ok. <u>CM Marriott</u>: there are 50+ parade entries.
